## Clinical Snippet

Solitary osteochondroma in lumbar spinous process



A 23-year-old man presented with solid painless mass at lower lumbar region. The lesion was treated with en-bloc resection. Histopathology confirmed the diagnosis of osteochondroma. No post op neurological complications noted. Osteochondroma is a benign bone tumour, pedunculated or sessile, arising by progressive enchondral ossification of growing cartilaginous cap. It is usually found in the metaphysis of long bones. Exophytic lumbar variety is uncommon presenting with palpable mass or spinal deformity.



## Case Scenario Toxic epidermal necrolysis (TEN)



An 8 years old male presented with rapidly spreading skin lesions over 48 hours after medications for an acute febrile illness. There were painful vesico-bullous skin lesions with erythema involving face, ears, chest and back. Nikolsky sign was positive. Oral mucosa was severely involved. After ruling out sepsis, he was treated with IV dexamethasone and cyclosporine and supportive care was given with IV fluids, skin care, Ryle's tube feeds, Clindamycin and Linezolid. Femoral central venous line was maintained for 10 days. He had concomitant severe drug induced liver injury (DILI) (total bilirubin 23 mg/dl, SGPT 540 IU/L). He was discharged uneventfully after 14 days.

## An Overview....

## Stevens-Johnson Syndrome/ Toxic Epidermal Necrolysis (SJS/TEN) Dr Jasleen Kaur, Professor & Head, Dermatology Dr Bharat Mehra, Assistant Professor, Pediatrics

## Q1 - What is Stevens-Johnson syndrome/ Toxic epidermal necrolysis?

.Toxic epidermal necrolysis (TEN) is a life threatening severe epidermolytic adverse cutaneous drug reaction that predominantly involves the skin and mucous membranes. Stevens-Johnson syndrome (SJS) and TEN are considered to be two ends of a spectrum of the same disease, differing only by their extent of skin involvement (SJS 10%, TEN > 30%). They are characterized by an abrupt onset of a tender/painful red skin rash evolving into multiple coalescing blisters. Affected parts of skin may come off in sheets (Pseudo Nikolsky's sign) due to extensive necrosis and detachment of the epidermis

#### Q2 - What is the Incidence of SJS/ TEN?

 The incidence of SJS worldwide is 1.0-6.0 per million and that of TEN is 0.4-1.2 per million. The rate of SJS/TEN spectrum is nearly two times higher in Asian population as compared to Caucasian. The mortality rate of SJS, SJS-TEN overlap and TEN are 4.8%, 19.4% and 14.8% respectively.

#### Q3 - What are the common drug associated?

 Commonly implicated drugs include: Antibiotics- Cotrimoxazole, Beta-lactams, fluoroquinolones; Anti-convulsantscarbamazepine, lamotrigine, phenytoin, phenobarbitone; Allopurinol; Nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) (oxicam type mainly) and Nevirapine (non-nucleoside reverse transcriptase inhibitor).

#### Q4 - What is the differential diagnosis?

- Drug hypersensitivity syndrome, Drug Rash with Eosinophilia and Systemic Symptoms (DRESS).
- Staphylococcal scalded skin syndrome and toxic shock syndrome.
- Erythema multiforme major (with mucosal involvement).
- Exfoliative erythroderma.
- Mycoplasma infections.
- Bullous systemic lupus erythematosus.
- Paraneoplastic pemphigus.

#### Q5 - How to manage SJS/ TEN?

 Mainstay treatment of TEN is supportive care until reepithelialization of the affected skin. Supportive measures include immediate cessation of offending agent, fluid resuscitation, pain management, aseptic wound care, eye care, mouth care and nutritional support. Pharmacotherapy includes systemic steroids, cyclosporine, IV-Ig, and plasmapheresis.

#### Q6 - Name the various complications seen?

- Serious complications may occur. These include:
- Infection leading to septicemia, shock, multi-organ failure.
- Acute respiratory distress syndrome.
- Gastrointestinal ulceration, perforation and intussusception.
- Hepatitis.
- Thromboembolism and disseminated intravascular coagulopathy.
