# Atypical Presentation of Multiple Myeloma







A 35-year-old female presented with breathlessness and fever for 3 days. ESR was 108 mm/hr, CRP 686.1 mg/L and serum calcium 11.20 mg/dL. She had mild renal dysfunction (S Creatinine = 1.4, BUN = 27.4 mg/dL). There was reversal of Alb-Glob ratio (0.2) and presence of 'M' spike (4.60 g/dL). X-Ray dorsolumbar spine showed anterior wedging and collapse of D8 vertebral body. CECT Chest revealed large consolidations involving most of the right lung field and left lower lobe. Bone Marrow showed an increase in plasma cells. Patient was eventually diagnosed to have multiple myeloma (MM). Atypical presentation of MM in the form of chest infection (pneumonia) is uncommon. MM is rare in patients under 40 years of age Dr. Raman Kumar Sharma Professor of Medicine

### Case Scenario

# Acute Severe Hemolysis With Methemoglobinemia





A 12 year old boy presented with sudden onset of dark coloured urine and increasing pallor for 3 days and altered sensorium. The child had tachycardia, feeble pulses, severe pallor and no hepatosplenomegaly. SpO2 was 75% on high flow mask and did not improve even on 100 % FiO2, ABG showed pO2 365 mmHg and SaO2 of 99.8%. Hb was 3 gm/dl, LDH 4893 U/L, total bilirubin 8.9, direct 2.3, SGOT/SGPT normal. The classical dark chocolate colour of arterial blood and disparity between SpO2 and SaO2 (known as saturation gap) evoked suspicion of methemoglobinemia. Urine was negative for RBCs and positive for free haemoglobin. G6PD deficiency was ruled out. 5 ml methylene blue 1% was given over 15 mins (0.12ml/kg) with 3 doses. Saturation gradually improved to 95% and clinical parameters improved rapidly. The child revealed that he had consumed samosa with lots of 'red chutney' a day prior. The colouring agent had possibly caused acute haemolysis and methemoglobinemia.

### Q1 - What is the difference between SpO<sub>2</sub> and SaO<sub>2</sub>?

• SpO<sub>2</sub> is the percentage of oxygenated haemoglobin determined by pulse oximeter in capillary blood (based on Beer-lambert law). SaO2 is percentage of oxygenated haemoglobin in arterial blood (determined by blood gas machine). It is further of two types - 'measured SaO<sub>2</sub>' and 'calculated SaO<sub>2</sub>'. Oxyhemoglobin saturation directly measured via spectrophotometric principles (shining light through sample) by a device called a CO-Oximeter from blood gas is measured as SaO<sub>2</sub>. Oxyhemoglobin saturation calculated or estimated using variables PaO2, PaCO2, pH and patient temperature is calculated SaO<sub>2</sub>

# Q2 - What is Methemoglobinemia?

 Methemoglobinemia is a condition with life threatening potential in which diminution of the oxygen carrying capacity of circulating haemoglobin occurs due to the conversion of some or all of the four iron species from the reduced (Fe2+) state to the oxidized ferric (Fe3+) state.

### Q3 - What are the causes?

- Congenital Due to deficiency of enzyme cytochrome b5 reductase.
- Acquired drugs: oral/iv nitro-glycerine, local anaesthetics (topical benzocaine, prilocaine), overdose of dapsone or phenazopyridine, naphthalene inhalation.
- Toxic exposures nitrates in well water, aniline dyes etc.

# Q4 - How is the diagnosis of Methemoglobinemia made?

 Clue to the diagnosis of methemoglobinemia is the presence of a 'saturation gap'. This occurs when there is a difference between the oxygen saturation measured on pulse oximetry and the oxygen saturation in arterial blood by blood gas analyser. The diagnosis is confirmed by arterial blood gas with CO-oximetry, which will determine the methaemoglobin percentage.

#### Q5 - What is the treatment?

- It is treated with antidotal therapy of methylene blue 1% (0.1-0.2 mL/kg) IV very slowly over several minutes. May repeat in 1 hour if needed. Other treatment options are:-
  - ☑ High dose ascorbic acid (vitamin c)
  - ☑ Exchange transfusion
  - ☑ Hyperbaric oxygen therapy

# Q4 - What are the clinical features?

• In mild cases (MetHb < 10% with no anemia) patients may be asymptomatic with mild cyanosis. As MetHb levels further rise or patient is anemic, there may be breathlessness, tachypnea, tachycardia, headache, altered sensorium and seizures.
